## **APRE** News

Dear Parents/Caregivers,

This is the *Year of Grace* in the Archdiocese when we are encouraged to become more aware of God's presence in our lives and in our world. This experience of God's Grace brings Peacefulness into our lives, the Virtue in focus for this fortnight.

Peacefulness is an inner sense of calm - it comes from becoming still in order to reflect and meditate on our inner wisdom and receive answers. A peaceful heart is one that is free from worry and trouble. It is in becoming present to our inner spirit that we can look at things quietly, so we can more clearly understand them and thus come up with creative solutions. It is learning to live in the present.

Meditation can help us rest our minds and be at peace. There are several ways to meditate and each person needs to find the way that is best for them. One suggestion is to just sit in a quiet place and relax your mind. Be aware of your breaths as you breathe in and out for the first few minutes. Now take your mind on a much needed vacation. Imagine being in your favourite place in the world. Maybe it is the serenity of the beach, the colourful garden of an array of flowers, or maybe it is in the mountains among God's trees of wonderful nature.

Rest your mind in this place seeing all the colours, feeling the breeze, feeling the warmth of the sunshine. Use your imagination to really feel your mind's environment. Picture yourself in this place, feeling love, peace, and joy. You can do this for 10 or 15 minutes, more if you like, but when you are done just let your mind be still. Don't think about anything, but keep your mind at peace. If intrusive thoughts or problems try to enter your mind, just gently push them away and go back to your place of comfort. Allowing yourself this time for meditation daily will rejuvenate your mind. It also introduces you to your inner self.

In the silence of our meditations, we can access the spirit of God that is within us. Sometimes, when we step back from having to make a decision and rest our minds, the way forward often becomes very clear. When we emerge from our meditations, we feel at peace. God is peace and meditating brings us to an acute awareness of the spirit of God within us. Only in silence can you hear God's whisper that will guide, support and love you on your journey through life. Mother Teresa often said that silence is where God speaks to us. She also said in essence: Close *your eyes, close your mouth and listen to God speak to you*. The busy hustle of life keeps us from finding this wonderful truth of God dwelling within as our friend, our guide and our comforter. He is always accessible to us, whenever we need Him. We are never, ever alone.

We all have a purpose in life and many do not know what this is because everyday stress and hustle and bustle keeps us too busy to become silent and listen to our inner truth. When we become acutely in tune to our inner being, we also become aware of the direction to take in life in line with our life's purpose. The secret of life lies within the soul.

"He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield..."(Psalm 91:4).

He also contributed a chapter to the book *Male Voices: Stories of boys learning through making music* (S D Harrison, Ed, 2009, ACER).
